

BY – LAWS

Langdon Area Hockey Boosters, Inc.

The Langdon Area Hockey Boosters (aka LAHB) Board of Directors will be made up of a President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, a Coaches Representative, and two At Large members, to be referred to as Community Representatives. The At Large members can be coaches, parents, or someone interested in the Hockey Program.

The terms of board members will be two years. President, Treasurer and one Community Representative will be elected to the board on odd numbered years. Vice-President, Secretary, Coaches Representative and a second Community Representative will be elected on even numbered years, for the same length of terms.

Elections will be held at the annual meeting. Nominations will be taken from the floor for new board members, as well as those interested in serving again. If more nominations are received than positions available a paper ballot will be provided and the top vote receivers for the positions will be appointed to the board.

President has the power to appoint a member to the board, if necessary, with the board's approval.

The Board will appoint committees as needed.

There must be at least seven members, other than the board, in attendance for election of the board, approval of the budget, major changes in by-laws. These must be voted on by a quorum of members of the club.

Routine business to be voted on and acted upon by the board, has to have a majority vote.

An agenda of business meetings will be made available upon request and posted at the Dakota Spirit Arena prior to the start of the meeting. Meeting dates and times of the LAHB board will be posted on the calendar available at www.dakotaspiritarena.org.

Langdon Area Hockey Boosters shall be managed by the Board of Directors. Any officer may carry out the decisions of the Board. Management of the Arena shall include the right to bar entry onto the premises, and to report trespass violations to law enforcement.

The Langdon Blades Hockey Players, Parents & Coaches Handbook, which includes the North Dakota Amateur Hockey Association (NDAHA) Code of Conduct, shall be followed by all members and visitors to the building. The Board shall hear complaints arising from violations of the Players, Parents & Coaches Handbook, and make disciplinary decisions.

Complaints involving confidential information or law enforcement shall be discussed and decided on in a private executive session.

Schedules for games will be set up by the coaches and their assistants, other than the ones set up by leagues when we are in them.

Transportation to games is the responsibility of the parents. The parents are responsible for the child's actions whether the parent is at the game or not.

All families will be expected to contribute time and services toward the successful function of the booster club.

MULTI-PURPOSE FACILITY:

The Dakota Spirit Arena is a multi-purpose facility available for various community activities, such as, but not limited to: Figure Skating, general skating, hockey, public meetings, and community events.
